SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Mr. President. Chief Richard Anderson, as the resolution states, has been a member of the Omaha Police Department for 30 years and Chief for 14 of those years.

PRESIDENT: I don't believe Senator Pirsch can even hear herself talk let alone anyone else hear her. Thank you. Continue. Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: As evidenced consistently by the federal government crime statistic reports proves or shows or demonstrates that Richard Anderson has been an able administrator of the Omaha Police Department. He has been asked to serve on so many committees that I could not list them, both statewide and nationalwide, and has been on our Nebraska Crime Commission. I urge your support for this resolution. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on LR 66? Hearing none, Senator Pirsch, I guess that is your opening and your closing. I don't see anyone else, so the question is the adoption of LR 66. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The resolution 66 is adopted. I guess that will constitute the resolutions for the day. We are ready then to take up agenda item #5. consent calendar. We have some additions and deletions on your copy. If you will take your copy of the consent calendar. which we are about to get into, I will read for you...go down the list and read for you those that I have on my desk as having been deleted, and there is one addition, one added by the Speaker. In the first group, LB 535 is deleted, and LB 424. 424 is deleted. Going down into the second group on the first page at the head of that list is inserted LB 99. That's just ahead of LB 385. And going down the list LE 421 is deleted, and LB 261. 261 is deleted. On LB 444, a correction there. That is Government Committee rather than Burrows, Landis and Koch, and it changes the requirements for the budget statement by political subdivisions as the reason for...that's the intent of that bill. At the bottom of that list LB 231...231 is deleted. Turning over to the other side, other page, we find LB 139 is deleted. So I guess, Mr. Clerk, we are ready then to proceed with the consent calendar. Senator Koch, did you have Senator Koch, for what purpose do you arise?
