I think the definition is probably pretty good as it is, but to try and meet her concern, we are willing to sit down and spend some time with her. My feeling, quite frankly, is the bill if it is passed in its present form would be a perfectly good piece of legislation but, again, I am concerned. I don't want to unduly concern Mrs. O'Shea so I think Senator Johnson and I both are willing to talk to her but the bill has not got a problem I think. I think it is a good bill. We are just trying to recognize the fact that she has expressed an interest and we are willing to work with her.
