It calls for a study to evaluate the effectiveness of the Nebraska Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education. LR 141 by Senator Koch. The purpose of the resolution is to study legal provisions regarding tenure of teachers and administrators in public schools, Educational Service Units, and Technical Community Colleges. And LR 142 offered by Senator Wiitala. The purpose of the resolution is to authorize the study of the Workmen's Compensation Act with the special emphasis on the adequacy of reimbursement to injured employees, the minimum and maximum allowable weekly benefits and the appropriateness of the amounts.
