original agenda which was published last Friday. So I will move that we follow the Speaker's agenda as circulated last Friday.

PRESIDENT: I realize that is what you are doing, however, the way the Speaker has presented the agenda this morning and that is his prerogative and his privilege to adjust the agenda to meet circumstances as he sees them, since he has changed it, then the only way you can change it back is to make a motion to overrule that and go back to the original. Speaker Marvel, don't you agree that is the only way we can get this thing to a head and move along?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well there have been some comments made and I know they are sincere but there has been no deal made. I learned that early in the game and I think those who are pushing for a change basically are sincere in the fact that they want A bills that have general fund implication, they want those put in a different category than the others. Maybe I could ask Senator Lamb a question and try to understand.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, would you respond.

SPEAKER LAMB: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Would you repeat your dilemma so ...?

SENATOR LAMB: Well, first of all, since the agenda came out Friday we alerted a number of people in the area as to the fact that a number of bills in which they are interested would be read Monday and Tuesday and possibly Wednesday. And so this does handicap that group. Beyond that I would say that this body has passed the appropriations bills as the Appropriations Committee and have amended the Appropriation Committee bills, so it seems to me that if we wait for the Governor to do all of his line item vetoing or vetoing and then if we have to have a long discussion on a number of those, the time frame in which these bills with A bills are turned loose, are going to be delayed, nobody knows how long. And it looks to me like it may be well down toward the very end of the session. I don't think the Legislature should have to do that sort of thing and as Senator Warner has indicated, other years we have not done that under the identical motion which Senator Warner made early in the session. So it is my belief that we should go ahead and read these bills as planned today and tomorrow.

SPEAKER MARVEL: If we don't, then what is the dilemma as far as you are concerned? Mr. President, in order to try
