SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, it's withdrawn, I guess.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is from Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this little amendment is what I call my double-dipping amendment. As you are aware, there are now students in high school who are going to the technical community colleges for part of the day and to the high schools for part of the day, and under our present statutes it is possible for both the high school and the technical community college to claim that student for state aid purposes, and the only thing this amendment does is says that they both cannot claim it, that the technical community college will continue to claim them for the number of hours that they are there and that the high school will only claim them proportionately for the number of hours that they spend in high school so that it ends the possibility of double-dipping for the same student. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I rise to support Senator Beutler's amendment. I think it is important that this is placed in the statute.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, do you wish to close on your amendment? Are there any other amendments to the bill? Okay the motion is the adoption of the Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the Beutler amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The Beutler amendment to the bill is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Koch and DeCamp move to amend the bill. It is Request 2448.
