CLERK: 23 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Any other motions on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, before we then read on Final Reading, LB 134, I would like to...the Chair takes the privilege of introducing Mrs. Robert Young from Sloan, Iowa, Senator Marge Higgins' sister. Would...she is under the south balcony, would Miss Young stand up and be recognized. Welcome to the Nebraska Legislature, Miss. Okay, we are ready then for Final Reading. All members please return to your desks. We are ready then to commence Final Reading on LB 134. 134. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 134 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 134 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on pages 2247 and 2248 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 11 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.
