PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker, thank you. Members, I think we should have added another Whereas in there. Senator Hefner got up and talked about 8 cheese plants in the State of Nebraska. Probably I should have added a Whereas Ord has a cheese plant in there too, so I've got to get my little cheesy bit in there. Ord is celebrating their 100th year. You go back through the history of the area, the Loup Valley was settled in about 1870 and at that time there wasn't much but elk and antelope and deer and it was the home of the Pawnee Indian which was basically an agriculture type people. Since then they have gone through drouths, blizzards and a whole bunch of hardships, and Ord in their 100th year now with this resolution would bring some honor to the community. And I urge your adoption. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right, no further discussion. I guess that is your opening and closing, Senator Wagner. The question is the adoption of LR 188. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.
