SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan, do you want to take up this motion at this time?

SENATOR CULLAN: No, I do not. I would lay the bill over for a day.

SENATOR CLARK: All right. That will conclude 378 for today. We will take up now LB 270 and I think he wants to pass that over because he is not here. LB 212 by Vard Johnson. We are going to read some things in first. The Call is raised but the noise level went up with it.
