PRESIDENT: Senator Newell. Alright, a Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of Calling the House vote aye, opposed nay. The motion is, shall the House go under Call. Have you all voted? I'll wait for you, Senator Sieck. The motion is, shall the House go under Call. Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 15 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excused? Everyone that is not on the board I guess. You can kind of look at the board. You can see those who are not here. Everyone is here now.

SENATOR NEWELL: Well we can allow call in votes then.

PRESIDENT: Alright, we can allow call in votes. If you will very quickly call in your vote I am going to call for a reporting of the vote.

CLERK: Senator Wesely voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Any other call in votes? Everyone is here.

CLERK: Senator Sieck voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Has everyone voted that wants to vote? Record the vote.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: You are most rapid today. Could we then call the roll?
