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what was going to happen and if you had any amendments that you'd like to put on a bill up there, I don't care what it is, you can put it on the bill if you were particularly interested in that bill. But I think what he is attempting to do and I have to agree, that you have to have the process of the Legislature flowing evenly and that is exactly I think what he is attempting to do. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Well, Mr. Chairman, here we go. We've already wasted twelve minutes and the Speaker told us this morning what we were going to do. Now if you think we're pushing things now you wait until about the last ten days and you will see a real push. We'd better get going. I move we proceed with the Speaker's suggestion and take up these bills.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You've heard the motion and the second. Senator Koch, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR KOCH: I move the previous question on Senator Kremer's proposal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, do you wish to close?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I also appreciate your efforts to expedite the process and I don't think no one is trying to hold up anything. I don't think it is necessary to even have a motion. Let me just ask, perhaps the solution to the problem. If the Clerk of the Legislature could put an asterisk before the Select File bills on the agenda the night before then we would know which ones would be expedited on Select File the following day and that would probably solve all the problems. Would it be possible to do that, Mr. Speaker? Simply asterisk the ones that are without amendments on them.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well one of the problems, Senator Beutler, is that you may start with a bill in a certain fashion and before you get through the day that bill is changed. Its identity is changed.

SENATOR BEUTLER: An amendment could come in in the morning but at least I would know which ones are subject to that sort of process. Well at any rate, thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I have this comment to make before we go to another item. First of all, I appreciate your comments. I would hope that if any of the rest of you have suggestions that you leave them at our office and we will try to incorporate as many of them as possible into the agenda for the
