PRESIDENT: So that is really four bills, Senator Lamb, is that right? Including an A bill.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, that is correct.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I wonder if I might ask Senator Lamb a question.

PRESIDENT: You certainly may. Senator Lamb, I'm sure you will respond.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Lamb, do I understand or do I assume that you will be working on setting the agenda for the week then in the absence of our Speaker? Is that correct?

SENATOR LAMB: That is correct, Senator Carsten. However, Senator Marvel does have the agenda laid out as best he can at this point but as you know things come up from time to time and we may have to make adjustments as the week progresses.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: This is important that the members of the Legislature know who it is that they would contact to make those adjustments and that would be Senator Lamb so just so everybody knows that. Okay. Any further questions? Thank you. We will then proceed with agenda item #4, resolutions, LR 243, Mr. Clerk. LR 243.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 243 and the first item I have on that is a request from Senator Newell to add his name as cointroducer to LR 243.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell has requested his name be added as cointroducer. Any objections? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 243 offered by Senators Koch and Newell is found on page 1039 of the Legislative Journal. (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body, I introduced this resolution in behalf of this new organization which was developed in 1982. You heard the resolution. The two originating campuses were Peru and the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, now joined by the University of Nebraska
