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to drive a car which may help them to get a job. Do you understand that, Senator Johnson? May help them to get a job, because a lot of young teenagers do drive back and forth to work. In fact, I am told 70 percent of the seniors in Omaha have jobs, most of them fast food houses, but at least they need transportation to get there and back because MAT doesn't go everywhere in the City of Omaha. I reject the whole business. It is a frivolous amendment. Both of them are.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Beutler, do you want to talk on the Vard Johnson amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I just wanted to make one quick point and that is that I don't want to lose this money to education. The Vocational Education sector of education is going to take a terrible beating in the next couple years, and whatever you may think about expanding it, they are going to have just lots and lots of trouble keeping it at the level that it is at. And for that reason I think I am not particularly enthusiastic....for that reason only I am not particularly enthusiastic about Senator Johnson's amendment and I certainly hope that you would give further thought to shifting that money to Vocational Education because if you don't give Vocational Education any money, as a practical matter, as a truly practical matter you are going to be decreasing Vocational Education by a couple million dollars over a period of a couple years. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: Mr. President and members, I certainly reject both Senator Johnson and Senator Beutler's amendment. Let me give you just one good reason and I don't believe it has been emphasized yet. Insurance companies give a break on insurance to students who have taken Driver Ed. Now insurance companies aren't in the habit of throwing away money, and if they didn't think that Driver Ed did a good job, would they lower their rates for these students? Of course not. Now, is there a better reason, I mean dollar and cent reason why we shouldn't continue with Driver Ed? I don't think so.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Higgins, Senator Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I, too, would oppose both of these amendments. I think that maybe last year I did oppose the extra \$40 in
