fairness this is not unreasonable. We are placing \$150,000 in the general which was decreased because the Appropriations Committee thought there were certain things going to happen that didn't happen. Then because of not accurate figures as Senator Carsten mentioned a moment ago from the county treasurers, they were losing \$187,000, a little bit more than that under 816, and now Senator Carsten just confirmed that this is accurate, so, therefore, I ask that the body look favorably upon this amendment as being only fair and equitable again, otherwise it will come off of property taxes. I ask for the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Koch amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. He was closing, Senator Warner. Did you want to say something? Have you all voted on the Koch amendment? You could probably save a Call of the House if you would just vote. I don't care how you vote but you don't vote.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: I am going to call the vote, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, I dislike doing this because I know it takes time but obviously we need a Call of the House and give people an opportunity to make a decision. I ask for a Call of the House.

SENATOR CLARK: Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of a Call of the House will vote aye, opposed vote nay. Do you want to take call in votes? All right, we will take call in votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 mays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: We are under Call. If all senators will check in, please. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. Call ins, yes.

CLERK: Senator Vard Johnson voting yes. Senator Hoagland voting yes. Senator Burrows voting yes. Senator Richard Peterson voting yes. Senator Chronister voting yes. Senator Kilgarin voting yes. Senator Fenger voting no. Senator VonMinden voting yes. Senator Newell voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Announce the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.
