CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The rules are suspended and the Clerk will read LB 761 on Final Reading.

CLERK: (Read LB 761 on Final Reading.) (Recorder turned off for Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: About five minutes before this bill is completed, if all Senators will get back into their seats please, we can be able to vote on the bill. Continue reading.

CLERK: (Continued reading.) (Recorder off.)

SENATOR CLARK: All Senators will be in their seats please. All provisions of law according to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. It takes 33 votes.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1809 and 1810, Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 2 nays, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. The next bill is 531, a constitutional amendment. Bernice Labeledz isn't here so we will stall that off a little while. We will take 754 with the emergency clause.

CLERK: (Final Reading on LB 754.) (Recorder turned off for Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: About three or four minutes on this bill.

CLERK: (Continued reading.) (Recorder off).

SENATOR CLARK: The question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor will vote aye, opposed vote no.
