SENATOR LAMB: That could be a possibility, but at this point the Governor is not making any. . .he will not say that he will do that, because, he could theoretically have a big pile of bills there that he would be expected to act on in a few minutes and that is an impossible thing. So, the only assurance that we have at this point is that the bills that are placed on his desk on Wednesday would be back for our override on Friday.

SENATOR VICKERS: The only reason I ask that is that there would be an opportunity then yet to get a bill off of Select File on Tuesday and still have it read on Final Reading on Friday, is that correct?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak, do you have a question?

SENATOR DWORAK: A question of Senator Lamb.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR DWORAK: On next week's schedule. Senator Lamb, how probable now is it Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday are in fact what we are going to follow. Is that still fluid? We changed those dates now. . . .

SENATOR LAMB: No, I'm planning to do that. That is definite.

SENATOR DWORAK: There is no way we could go Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday then and sine die Thursday?

SENATOR LAMB: Well that won't be my recommendation. I think at this point the people, as Senator Stoney has indicated, need to have a better indication of when we will be in session. So at this point, it does not look like we can get the bills read on Final in time so that we can have an override opportunity on Thursday, so in order to be sure that we know what our schedule is, I think we had just better say Thursday is a recess day, Friday is a session day, the 60th day.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you, Senator Lamb.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett, did you have a question?

SENATOR BARRETT: No question, Mr. President, I would move that we recess until 1:30.

PRESIDENT: There are still some questions here and so I realize that we do, but I would like to get the questions in because you
