LB 378

SENATOR CULLAN: Well, Mr. President, we're dealing with six issues that Senator Schmit has identified in the summary that he has and all I really know about the six issues are the one or two sentence explanations of these issues which Senator Schmit has provided to us.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan, I correct myself. I said that you could. You cannot. You cannot divide at any point. We've already ruled that way several times this year, this session.

SENATOR CULLAN: Okay.

PRESIDENT: You cannot at any point divide a motion to return. You either live or die with the thing as you have it.

SENATOR CULLAN: Okay, I accept that ruling. Then, Mr. President, I would like to speak about Senator Schmit's amendments to LB 378.

PRESIDENT: We did this one time, Senator Cullan, if you recall, where the introducer, I forget who it was, did withdraw part of the motion, took it out of his motion, took those matters out that would be not germane. Senator Schmit, do you understand what I am saying?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I'd just like to say that at this time, again, I think I made my point. I've offered the amendments. I think Senator Cullan has commented. I do not wish to delay the work of the Legislature any longer. I recognize that Senator Cullan has some valid concerns about the extent of the amendment. I would hope that the amendment would be discussed in the Public Health Committee in subsequent sessions and I would ask for the unanimous consent at this time to withdraw the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn. Now any further amendments?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cullan, you may... You have nothing further? We will read the bill because your motion was, since there is no other amendments pending so we are ready to read the bill. Read the bill, Mr. Clerk. All members are supposed to be at your desks. We are on Final Reading.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 378 on Final Reading.)
