SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: The Legislature will come to order. We will have the prayer this morning by Reverend Ray Daniel, College View Seventh-Day Adventist Church.

REVEREND DANIEL: (Prayer offered.)

SENATOR CLARK: Roll call. Record.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you have any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

I am not aware of any opinion that has been asked to that point so I really can't address it. I would agree that based upon a series of letters that have come from the Attorney General that that point may be a valid one to raise but I am not aware of any reason to assume a conclusion either way.
