CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hoagland has received 26 votes, Senator Chambers 22 votes, there is one abstention.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland, you are Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Colleagues, I appreciate very much your vote, the expression of confidence. The Judiciary Committee is, as Senator Johnson indicated, a committee of considerable substance. I am honored to serve as chairman and will certainly do as best that I can to execute the wishes of all of you. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed to vote on the committee chairman for the Committee on Miscellaneous Subjects. Nominations are in order. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I rise to nominate Rex Haberman for the chairmanship of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee. Rex is a man experienced in local government, with a long history of public service, a successful businessman, he has served in the Legislature for six years. We were colleagues when we first came to the Legislature, and classmates. He has been an experienced committee member and chairman. He served for two years as the Agriculture Committee Chairman, and as I say is a six year veteran of the Legislature. I nominate Senator Rex Haberman for this chairmanship.

PRESIDENT: The nomination of Senator Haberman is placed on the record. Are there other nominations? Senator Chronister.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Mr. President, colleagues, it gives me great pleasure to place in nomination for Chairman of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee Senator Elroy Hefner. Senator Hefner was first elected to the Legislature in 1976. He was reelected in 1980, and again in 1984. He has served as chairman of this committee for the last four years. The Miscellaneous Subjects Committee has dealt with thorny and controversial issues as well as very important ones many times. Senator Hefner has demonstrated his leadership qualities by capably dealing with these issues in an honest, forthright, effective and equitable way. His continued chairmanship of this important committee will be a great
