PRESIDENT: The name of Senator Pirsch is placed in nomination. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I just move that nominations cease and be declared a unanimous ballot.

PRESIDENT: You've heard that motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. Senator Pirsch is the Chairman of Intergovernmental Cooperation Committee. We will proceed with nominations for the Chairman of the Committee on Rules. Nominations are in order. Nominations for the committee chairmanship of the Rules Committee. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to place in nomination, for the chairmanship of the Rules Committee, the name of Senator Pat Morehead. The Rules Committee, for those of you who are freshmen, is the committee that basically deals with the Legislature's internal rules and, of course, those are the rules by which we pass all legislation that goes through this particular institution. If there ever was a committee where a sense of fairness was important, I think it is this Rules Committee because if these rules that we use and abide by are fair then in a process sense all of the legislation that we pass in this Legislature will be fairly dealt with. So you can see it is a rather fundamental function dealing with the rules of the Legislature. Fairness first, and those of you who have dealt with Senator Morehead know she has been fair in all her dealings with people, and after fairness I think good judgement and a sense of balance, an exquisite sense of balance. Those of you in the front now have my visual aid. Those of you in the back will have it momentarily. I present this to you as proof that Senator Morehead indeed has a sense of balance, an exquisite sense of balance. Those of you who are having a little bit of trouble will identify her as the one on the far left with the finger pointed, toes squarely on the ground, balanced. I have been saving this picture for months and am delighted, cousin, to let you know at this time what it was. But in a more serious vein I am really happy to be able to nominate Senator Morehead. I think that I have said already what needed to be said, a sense of fairness, an ability to deal with people, and a sense of the importantness of the
