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having to do with the jurisdictions of the committees. I think that by this time next year we are going to have some very serious and important proposals to you with regard to altering the jurisdictions of certain committees. I think if you think about it a minute you will see that we really need...we haven't thought about this in years, we really need to sit down and think about this. We need to make some adjustments. For example, and I've discussed this with Senator Rupp already, it is quite clear to me that it was never really intended by the Legislature that constitutional revisions should be in a particular committee. It makes, logically, a lot more sense for constitutional revisions to be dealt with by the subject matter committees that know what that constitutional revision is dealing with. So if you have a constitutional revision that deals with the criminal law it would be handled by Judiciary, agriculture by the Agriculture Committee because the people on that committee understand that subject and will have a better chance of understanding the import of a constitutional revision. So that is one change we need to make. We need to adjust Senator Rupp's committee. I think he even agrees to that himself. I only mean to tell you that by way of example. I think there are going to be a half a dozen other major ideas. I know that Senator Morehead has some ideas about rules. I think that we can come to you next year with some serious discussion of a number of our rules. I know that I give more importance to our rules than most people do, but I really think that it is well for us to go to confession once in awhile, so to speak, to think about how we do things internally and to be sure that the way we are doing things internally is the most effective and the most fair way of doing it. Unless we change this rule we will not be able to present that to you next year, except on the basis of a 30 vote rule. I don't think it is fair to ask the Rules Committee or the Executive Committee to face a 30 vote rule in order to do it. I think we ought to be able to do it at the beginning of the session and give it to you on a 25 vote, up or down basis, majority rules. For that reason I would ask your indulgence in making this particular rule change. Thank you.
