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three-fifths majority. Now the question is, that is 30 votes. Do we want to amend the rules with 30 votes, or do we want to amend them, every year before we adopt them, with 25 votes. There is no reason, and I agree with some of these changes that Senator Beutler is talking about. It was my suggestion that Constitutional Revision and Recreation doesn't make all that much sense. I think constitutional amendment items or bills should go to the committee according to subject matter. It just would make a lot more sense. I agree that those changes should be made, but why can't we do them under our own rules. We've got rules here that require 30 votes to change the rules. Now if you think 25 votes should be the number of votes necessary to change rules, let's just change this rule I just read and do it across the board. I see no reason to get into this hassle at the beginning of the second year of our two-year session every time to change a bunch of rules on 25 votes when, under ordinary circumstances, it takes 30 votes. So if you would like to change the rule, so it only takes 25 votes to change the rules, we could do that. I think that would be the logical thing to do, if that is the way you want to proceed. So I would resist. I would oppose this proposed rule change. I think the one we adopted before, which would leave our rules the same for two years, is a good one, it is valid. It still gives us the options to change the rules whenever this body feels it is necessary. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Morehead.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I have a question of Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Senator Lamb, you are saying then you propose to change Section 2 as opposed to Section 1?

SENATOR LAMB: No, I'm not proposing that. I think it should stay at 30 votes. I think it should be 30 votes across the board. You should not have a time here, between the first year and the second year, when you can change the rules with only 25 votes. That doesn't make that much sense to me. I see it as a gimmick that you can then change the rules with only 25 votes between the two years of the session, whereas any other time it takes 30 votes. So we are creating a period here. It encourages people to have a whole lot of rule changes that may make it on 25 votes, but
