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won't make it on 30 votes. Then after the session starts we are locked into 30 votes. Doesn't make a bit of sense to me to have a 25 vote rule at one point, a 30 vote required to change the rules the rest of the time.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: So then, as the rules read, they can still be changed on a second year, except that it just would require the 30 votes.

SENATOR LAMB: Absolutely right.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: That's right. I guess that speaking as the new rules Chairman I certainly want to be certain that my chairmanship does not become a moot situation right away under the leadership or opposition of anyone else here. I guess that I really, at this point, feel like we should have the flexibility to change those rules on a yearly basis, or adjust those rules on a yearly basis. I would speak in favor of, obviously, the amendment that I did cosign with Senator Beutler. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner's light is on, Senator DeCamp's just went on. Senator Beutler, Senator Higgins is next on this motion, but Senator Beutler is before Senator Higgins, that is what I meant. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Are there other lights on, Mr. Speaker? I'd just close unless it is a long...

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, I just wanted to ask Senator Beutler a question, if Senator would yield. Senator Beutler, in your proposal you mentioned that the previous Executive Board had done a great deal of work in looking into this. Are you proposing that just this year we adopt the rules for one year only so that next year we can go through all these things at the...I mean so that this year we can go through what the Executive Board had talked about the last two years, and then next year go back to the old adopting the rules for two years instead of just one? Or am I making it plain? Do you understand?

SENATOR BEUTLER: You are making yourself quite clear. My primary intention is to be able to deal with things next year. The way the rule change is drafted, though, it would
