The motion pending before the House is the motion by Senator Beutler to amend the rule. If you need to have the Clerk recite it more specifically we may here shortly. Call in votes may be made, if you wish to indicate to the Clerk your position.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp voting yes.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would ask the Clerk to read the motion again. Please pay attention to the Clerk so you know what you are voting on, it's a change in the rule.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion...the proposed rule change is on page 27 of the Journal. It would read as follows, "Rules shall be adopted at the commencement of each regular session, and as amended from time to time shall govern the Legislature for a period of one year." Present language allows for two years. That is the change.

Senator Hoagland voting yes.

PRESIDENT: You may call in your vote.

CLERK: Senator Rod Johnson voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Sieck and Senator Schmit, the House is under Call. Please return to the Chamber. Senator Chambers is not excused. If you are in the building, Senator Chambers, please report to the Chamber. Senators Sieck, Schmit and Chambers, the House is under Call. Members may indicate to the Clerk their position, aye or nay, on this motion. Motion is the adoption of a proposed amendment by Senator Beutler to the rules making it possible for the rules...for the permanent rules to stand only one year at a time instead of the full two years.

CLERK: Senator Eret voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Members may call in your vote to the Clerk on this motion.
