

you in the Chamber? Do you wish to speak? Senator Harris, we are still on the second point of the Lamb resolution concerning the number in the delegation and not on the resolution itself. Very well. Senator Higgins, do you wish to speak on this point?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, are we on the resolution or on the amendment?

PRESIDENT: No, we are not. We are on the second point of the Lamb amendment which is concerning the number of the delegation.

SENATOR HIGGINS: The number of the delegation.

PRESIDENT: From the original 20 it is suggested making it 10, that is the point of the amendment.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I'll speak when the resolution comes up. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Very well. Senator Rod Johnson, do you wish to speak on this point?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes, Mr. President. I will speak very briefly. I agree with the amendment. I am planning on supporting it as my name is on this resolution and also on Senator Lamb's resolution. I think that Senator Carsten has made many fine points to us and allows us to dwell upon some points that maybe we've overlooked. But we are still faced with the problem that we've got to do something for the farmers of Nebraska. Unfortunately, farmers are still selling their goods for wholesale and buying at retail. That is one of the big problems that we face right now in agriculture. Until we get a price, as Senator Sieck has pointed out, it's going to be very, very difficult for any of our farmers, whether they are worth \$1 million, or \$100,000 or \$50,000, they are probably not going to survive if we don't have the price. I know Senator Harris has made many points on the interest rates. They have equally caused the demise of our farmers. But the price would certainly help us. I, as Chairman of the Ag Committee, take no real stand on Senator Lamb's amendment, whether we send 10, 20 or the whole body back. I think it is a worthy idea that we consider going back as a unified group with other states. I think one of the other points that is very important is that
