PRESIDENT: Thank you. Is there further discussion? The motion is the adoption of the amendment to the Committee Report. All those in favor say aye and opposed vote no, and we have a machine vote. Please record your vote. The motion is the adoption of the amendment to the Committee on Committees Report on the assignment of members to committees. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment to the Committee on Committees Report.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the Committee Report is approved. Now the motion is to adopt the report as amended. Is there discussion? All those in favor of adopting the Committee Report as amended vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the adoption of the Committee on Committees Report as amended. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the Committee on Committees Report, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The report is adopted as a whole. Resolution number 6.
