PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the proposed rule change? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendment as presented by Senators Vickers and Johnson. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. You are voting on the Vickers amendment to the permanent rules. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Vickers' proposed change, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The proposal is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next change I have is offered by Senator DeCamp. Senator, this is your change found on page 97. It has to do with changing the agenda 30 to 25 votes.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I am not going to offer any changes. I would just like to get the rules permanently adopted here as quick as possible and for that reason I am not going to offer any now. These things can all be done later.

PRESIDENT: Is that withdrawing?

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes.

CLERK: All of them, Senator, then?

SENATOR LECAMP: Yes.

CLERK: All right. Mr. President, the next change I have is offered by the Speaker. Speaker Nichol would move to amend the rules by changing the requirement of priority bills with regard to committees. Committees would be allowed to select one priority bill as opposed to two priority bills.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.)
