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Nebraska to certain members of the Legislature. It has been a problem at the federal level and so it seems to me that it is appropriate to add it to our rules.

PRESIDENT: One minute, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Number six, "A Member of the Legislature shall retain one in his or her hire who does not perform duties commensurate with the compensation he or she receives." That seems pretty self-evident. Number seven, antidiscrimination provision. It should apply to the Legislature. Number eight, no hiring of relatives. I want to mention that I intend that to apply prospectively. It is not directed at anybody in this Legislature who may have indulged in that particular practice at this point in time. It is simply meant to end it in the future. It reflects our Executive Board policies which also state that that is not acceptable practice. Then it goes on to define what a relative is. Number nine. "A Member of the Legislature shall not knowingly solicit campaign contributions from persons he or she has employed to work in the Legislature." Our employees are at our will. We know that. I think it is important that we create a vehicle whereby they can be independent persons as much as possible. It doesn't prohibit the giving of contributions by those people, but simply the solicitation of those people. Number ten is a lobbying provision. Number eleven...I am going quickly now because I am about out of time, has to do with the mailing privilege and the franking privilege, the mailing privilege. Number twelve we have already discussed about. That is the enforcement provision. Thank you, Mr. Speaker, for your indulgence and I will stop at that point in time.

PRESIDENT: There are requests here for time from these senators and they will be introduced in this order, Senators Lamb, Haberman, DeCamp, Higgins and Remmers. The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb. Senator Lamb, are you here? Senator Lamb. Do you wish to speak on this measure, Senator Lamb?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, I guess I believe that this is a pretty comprehensive rule change that is being brought before us at this time. I am right behind you, Senator Beutler. And I am going to suggest, in fact, I will move that this rule change be referred to the Rules Committee.
