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care who the members are, and I am not just referring to those who are on it now, are going to decide that I, a grown man, who am a grandfather, who has taken care of all kinds of problems that I have confronted whether with the police, politicians, thugs, Christians and others, am going to submit to some collection of white people telling me, Ernie, you can't do that. I don't use profanity, but that might push me very close to doing so. There could be members of the Governor's party who would say that they don't want me to criticize things that the Governor has done, or to say that he has behaved politically. There might be people who want to punish me for saying that the Chaplain, you want to pay money to, has a drinking problem. They might say it is not proper to say that and I might say, well, before I say the public's money ought to be spent you ought to at least have somebody praying over people who can control his own personal life and because there are certain issues traditionally not discussed on the floor of the Legislature, there might be an attempt to try to squelch that discussion. And I am serving notice now that you can play whatever games you want to with each other but you are going to find out what it means to deal with a grown black man if you, in your arrogance, think you are going to control or corral me any kind of way. You can go jump. You can shove it. That is the worst language I will use although I have heard profane words spoken on the legislative floor, but I think that gives you an idea of what my position is. I will give you an example of the kind of thing that they might try to restrict my discussion of. I don't like the way the World Herald wrote an article about the Governor asking the FBI to look into the killing of a farmer because it shows how the white media protects white officials. There Steven Stingley is representing the World Herald who has talked to me on issues when he needs to talk to me and he will write two long columns about Kerrey asking for this investigation by the FBI when they have already told me, Steve, they are going to conduct it. Nowhere in the article was it mentioned. The Governor brought up issues which I addressed in a memo to him weeks ago and he chose not to respond to the memo about ballistics tests, and so forth. When it comes up in Steve's article he writes it as though the Governor decided this ought to be done. Well, the Governor is playing politics on an issue related to agriculture and that is an important issue to this state. Now if these rules were enforced, somebody might want to hop out of a seat and say, Ernie is not reflecting credit on the
