PRESIDENT: Very well, we will proceed to resolution 10. Excuse me, Mr. Clerk, may we have order in the Chamber please (gavel), have order for the presentation of the resolution. Read resolution 10, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 10 offered by Senator Scofield, found on page 135 of the Journal. (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Scofield. May we have order please. (Gavel.)

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Mr. President, members of the body, this is a historic time in my District, the 49th District, because 1985 is the year that my community starts to celebrate their 100th Anniversary. Many of you have already had that experience but, nevertheless, we are very excited about that prospect out there this year and there are a lot of celebrations planned. As you probably know, the development of the 49th District, like a good share of the rest of the state, followed the development of the railroad and Gordon, Nebraska happens to be the first community that is going to kick off its centennial celebration this year. Gordon, for those of you who have been there, is an interesting community. It is a progressive community, primarily an agricultural community, but a prosperous small town as well, that I am very impressed with, in particular their dedication to promoting the arts. And so I am looking forward to their 100th Anniversary and I invite you to join me in honoring Gordon on its 100th Anniversary. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there others to speak on LR 10? If not, I would like to have you carry my best wishes to that community, Senator Scofield. I have been invited to attend next Friday evening and I will be unable to attend. The question is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote aye or nay on resolution 10. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 10, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. Senator Lundy, would you be good enough to make a motion for the
