Hopefully all of this will be done by June 1, and each organization that participates in the program will be asked to take care of the seedlings or the plants for a two-year period by pulling the weeds and making sure that the trees do beautify the areas, the urban areas and the rural areas, and I think it is an exciting program and I urge each and every one of you to read the article.
