We passed the statute directing the Revisor of Statutes to make those name changes in every place that it was appropriate. That directive has been satisfied and the names have been changed and the statute is now no longer necessary, it is therefore being repealed. I would ask advancement of the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. President, Statute 46-705 and 46-706 gave the Department of Water Resources certain directives with regard to the transfer of records and duties and powers and other items. Those transfers have been made, the directives in the statutes have been completed and complied with and the statutes are no longer necessary. They therefore are being repealed.
