

as the Clerk has indicated it provides for the assumption of certain duties as between a couple of agencies and some renaming. The renaming, the assumption of duties was all to happen back in 1972, has happened and so now the statute is obsolete and I move the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? You have heard the explanation of the bill. All those in favor of advancing it please vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Chizek.

CLERK: Senator Chizek voting yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance LB 18, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 18 is advanced and thank you, Senator Beutler. Ladies and gentlemen, we'll be in session probably 15, 20 minutes yet to get the bills introduced that are here and of course I have sent notices to you as to when you should be getting your bills in or back to the Clerk for hearings. We will be meeting, of course, Monday and Tuesday next week and we will not be here next Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Monday and Tuesday we will be meeting at ten in the morning. That is all I can think of to tell you at this time, so at least some of you stick around for the introduction of the bills that we have coming up. Thank you.
