

stop a farm sale, not with violence, not with the threat of violence, or not with the recommendation that violence be used. But I will tell you what I did say to the farmers. Some of you have been in the military, and you have kids who have been in the military, and you were sent thousands of miles away to fight people you didn't even know on issues you didn't even understand, supposedly to make your homeland safe. Then when you come back, the ones who sent you over there are now going to take your home. They taught you to use violence and kill people you didn't even know, but if you talk about defending your home right now, then you have a problem. If they tell you the communists are going to take your land and own it in collectives and make you work on it, you become outraged. But if the bankers and the corporations do it, you can't make the leap and understand that there are certain interests that take things from people who are weak whether the ones who take it are called communists, capitalists, agribusiness people, or businessmen-farmers, or legislator-farmers. There is a reality out there which is going unheeded by the government of this state. Some of the farmers told me that when they went to the Conference of Governors at the hotel over there, they wished that I had been there because the Governors told them that they could talk to the Governors' aides about their problems and the Governors left. In Wahoo, they told me they were to write on a paper what it was they wanted to talk about and those who wrote the real issues related to the farmers or that of concern to them were not called to the microphone. They mentioned that a lady talked twenty or thirty minutes and filibustered the time and so did others so it was a pointless venture. Hundreds of them came down here a day before the Legislature went into session and they met with the Governor and others and again said they wished I had been there because they were treated like children and pushed away. They feel they are being humored, they are being patronized, but their real problems are not being addressed. So the Legislature is going to shut down for however long and leave me back here, leave me back here to tend to the issues of my purported enemies. Why should I help my enemies? If I am against all white people, shouldn't I be clicking my heels and jumping for joy now because white bankers are destroying white farmers, because a white SWAT team shot a white farmer, because the whole white society in this state which says it depends on agriculture is about to go under and the Governor has no answer, the Legislature has no answer, and my enemies have
