

SENATOR DECAMP: Read the amendment, whatever it is.

CLERK: To amend LB 4 on page 2, line 1, after the comma insert "and Sections 49-1408 and 49-14138."

SENATOR DECAMP: Oh, yes, yes, now I remember. Okay, this bill is a correcting bill, corrects previous errors made by the Legislature. It is a repealer to correct errors. This simply corrects one of the errors we made a few years ago when we created the Accountability Commission. It simply repeals it. Withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the amendment is withdrawn. Now do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR SMITH: I move its advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, you have heard the motion to advance the bill. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Number 5.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have no E & R amendments. I do have an amendment by Senator Beutler, however.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this also repeals a statute, however, its compass is not quite as broad as Senator DeCamp's, and it is serious. There was one more obsolete statute in that particular section that we overlooked. It is 46-707 which requires the Department of Water Resources to develop a map defining and illustrating underground water areas. Such a map upon its completion shall be submitted to the Legislature. It was 1967 legislation. I know from my own personal experience that the map has been done and submitted to the Legislature. The Department of Water Resources has indicated that it has been submitted. The statute is now obsolete because the purpose of the statute has been accomplished.
