SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It barely advances. LB 18.

CLERK: LB 18, I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR SMITH: I move the advancement of LB 18.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It advances. Senator Smith, thank you, you did great.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Proud of you. Senator Chambers, if you are in your office, we are ready for your motion to withdraw LB 31CA.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to withdraw LR 31 which was a constitutional amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, this was constitutional amendment which would take out of the Constitution the Clerk of the Supreme Court and the reporter. The Supreme Court had thought when this bill was introduced there would be other matters attached. Those did not develop and they felt this was too large a vehicle to carry such a small package. So I am asking that you allow me to withdraw it.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any objections? Okay, we need a machine vote on this. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: It is withdrawn. We are ready to go back to LR 39. Senator Warner, did you finish yesterday? Okay. And I don't really have the names of the lights that were on so if you had your light on yesterday, would you please turn them on now so that we can catch you. Senator Warner, your light is on, so you are on again.
