

SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR VICKERS: I guess what I am saying is that the intent of this resolution is to set the stage for us to do some meaningful things in the next few months that will hopefully deal with this situation. Finally, I have got a number of letters from Commonwealth depositors, as I know many of you have, with a lot of sad stories. I am now getting a lot of letters from rural Nebraska with a lot of sad stories. I simply want to point out that those people who lost life...their life savings in Commonwealth, lost money. Many of the people in rural Nebraska are losing right now a lot more than money. That piece of land that has been part of the family is not money but it is a way of life.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Time.

SENATOR VICKERS: It is their history and their future. We as legislators have got to be sympathetic and willing to try to deal with each other's problems and that is the intent of this amendment to LR 39 and I ask for its adoption. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you, Senator Vickers. We are now ready to vote on the Schmit-Vickers amendment or the Vickers-Schmit amendment, whichever it is, and all those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to on the Schmit-Vickers amendment? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. The next motion I have is by Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone LR 39, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I will withdraw that.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, any objections? So ordered.
