PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten. May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) So we can hear the speakers. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I rise this morning to speak for Senator Labeledz who is home sick this morning, but I am happy to fill in in her absence. And I would move for the adoption of the resolution.
