CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lundy would like to withdraw LB 649. Pursuant to our rules, that will be laid over. (See page 429 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, the Executive Board has scheduled a hearing on the revenue bond request for the expansion project at Wayne State College and Business and Labor and offers a hearing for Wednesday, February 20.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will be at ease for approximately ten minutes.

PRESIDENT: The Legislature will resume its deliberation. Do you have matters for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing for the record at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very well, we're ready to move into General File then. LB 51. (Gavel.) LB 51 on General File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 51 was offered by Senator Chronister. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 10 of this year, Mr. President. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. Urban Affairs did in fact conduct a public hearing. The bill has been advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chronister. May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Chronister.

SENATOR CHRONISTER: Mr. President and members, LB 51 would amend Section 17-419 to require approval of the governing body in a second class city or village before any plat can be vacated by owners of such plat. At the present time Section 17-419 allows the owners of any plat to vacate that plat or any part of it at any time before the sale of any lots simply by presenting a written instrument declaring it to be vacated without notice to or approval of the governing body. This has resulted in planning problems for second class cities and villages. Since the way 17-421 presently
