SENATOR HIGGINS: The bill, on the bill.

SENATOR MARSH: We are now ready to vote on the amendments to the bill by the Public Health and Welfare Committee. Those in favor signify by saying yes, opposed no. Senator Marsh voting yes.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting yes.

SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will record.

SENATOR MARSH: The amendments are adopted. Senator Miller, do you have another comment? Senator Miller's bill.

SENATOR MILLER: Only that these amendments were considered and that I think that they should be put in place. They were considered by the funeral directors, by the Department of Health and there was no opposition to any of it at the committee hearing.
