

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President, I don't as a member of the Legislature mean to be picky picky this morning, but Section 1 says that an identification card or the color photo must be affixed by allowing a person to file a certified copy of his or her birth certificate. Section 7 refers to a fund or a fee. Now I always understood that we were to have fiscal notes on bills that referred or had any fiscal impact. We do not have one on this bill, and I don't know whether anybody has one. So I would like to ask, first of all, we hold the bill till we get a fiscal note and, secondly, I would ask Senator Miller, Section 1, what does that mean? Providing for an identification card of a color photo affixed by a person to file a certified copy of his or her birth certificate. Nothing was said in the explanation or debate or anything about this, what size, what color, what is it going to cost or can you explain this a little bit?

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Haberman, I would request that the Clerk read information into the record at this point in response to one of your questions. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Well, Senator, apparently the...I have a fiscal note on the bill here and I think most of the other members have a notation in their bill books that there is no fiscal impact. Obviously, there was an error in that we didn't get your books, didn't get the notation in your bill book so I apologize to you. But the fiscal note that I have here indicates that there is no fiscal impact to the state agency and that the counties would no longer pay Registers fifty cents per certificate, thus decreasing the cost to county government. So there is no fiscal impact in terms of increased cost to either state or local government.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, then, Senator Miller, who pays or what...explain to me Section 1 about the color photograph.

SENATOR MILLER: Senator Haberman, as I understand it, that is no change, that is current present law.
