

SENATOR HABERMAN: Pardon?

SENATOR MILLER: As I understand it, that is current present law, that is there is no change there.

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, you amended the Section 23-394 providing for an identification card with a color photograph. That indicates to me that you amended a section and did the old section have the color photograph in it?

SENATOR MILLER: Yes, it did.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Madam Chairperson. Is this a committee Public Health and Welfare bill? It is Senator Miller's bill. Excuse me, Senator. I would like to ask on page 7, if you have the bill there in front of you, it would make it easier, line 9, it says, "Before any dead human body may be cremated, a cremation permit shall first be signed", etcetera. Then jumping down to line 15, it says, "A permit for disinterment shall be required prior to disinterment of a dead body or fetus." Would you know why they said "dead human body" in line 9 when they are going to cremate someone that is dead, but down under Section 5, subsection 5 here they add the word "fetus"? Is it saying that a fetus is not a human body, or would you know, Senator? Would you rather I addressed the question to the Chairman of the committee?

SENATOR MILLER: Well, I can answer it for myself.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Well, go ahead then.

SENATOR MILLER: I consider a fetus a human body, yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Well, then was there a specific reason to leave fetus out of line 9 on page 7?
