Higgins, have your questions been answered or can we deal with it in any further...?

SENATOR WESELY: Because I can assure you that the intent isn't to change any of the policy or anything but to try and make the language more uniform. So if there is something in there that catches your eye, Senator Higgins, we would be glad to work with you on it. But I do think it is an important bill. We ran out of time last year and I would hope we don't run out of time this year to make it part of our laws.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Marsh. I, too, have a question of Senator Wesely. Senator Wesely, if you will yield.

SENATOR WESELY: Sure.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Wesely, I, too, am concerned and possibly on Select File will be able to put some amendments on this bill. Can you tell me what the procedure is now for an abortion clinic on the aborted unborn child, what we do with the human body after it has been aborted?
