

SENATOR WESELY: Okay. Senator Labeledz, I remember that we talked about that issue with Senator Venditte back about four or five years ago and, frankly, I don't know the answer particularly. I know Section 4 was one thing we did pass and dealt with the fetal death question and it is not something that came up in the hearing so...because it really wasn't any change in our past policy, it wasn't an issue at that time. I would be more than happy to find the answer to your question and to respond on Select File, but I can assure you we are not trying to change any of that.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I, too, can recall when Senator Venditte was here that we did have some bill on the floor in regard...and it was the same year that one of the professional plumbers was called to an abortion clinic to clean out the garbage disposal and found that it was filled with the remains of an unborn child that was aborted. So I will work with you and possibly on Select File we may be able to correct the situation. Thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: Seeing no further lights, we now are ready to vote on the advancement of LB 42. Senator Miller, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MILLER: Yes. Yes, I do. Members of the Legislature, Madam President, I do wish to close by saying that I hope we did not confuse what we are trying to do here which is to make efficient...government more efficient by inserting that there may be some language in there that means that we are trying to do something else with unborn fetuses. This is not changing the present law any except that we are trying to make registration of birth and death certificates that were previously in the counties now at the state level, except for Lancaster and Douglas Counties.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. We are now ready to vote on the advancement of LB 42. Those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Senator Marsh voting aye.
