SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Madam President. (See page 450 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MARSH: LB 42 is advanced.

CLERK: LB 129 offered by Senator Marsh. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 11, referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Public Health and Welfare Committee amendments pending.

SENATOR LABEDZ PRESIDING

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Wesely on the committee amendments.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, this is a very small change to the bill, LB 129, which deals...it is a sunset bill for the audiologists. It is a bill that we need to pass this session. We are very pleased that Senator Marsh has brought it to us and we are able to deal with it quickly. The amendment basically identifies one section and the law talks about a statement dealing with oral rehabilitation by an audiologist and it is just not clear in there who signs that statement granting this rehabilitation. So it does identify that the audiologist is the one that signs the statement. It is very small in nature but it is an amendment we need to the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Marsh, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR MARSH: I urge you to adopt the committee amendments.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Seeing no further lights, we will now vote on the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
