important to make certain that in our actual value statutes we specifically say "actual value" for everything except for farm and ranchland. And so that is the last of the four overall amendments that the committee did adopt and put forward to you as one committee amendment. I, personally, think that these committee amendments are simply designed to clarify LB 30 to make LB 30 a more workable meaningful bill and to assist in its immediate implementation. I, at this time, would commend to you the committee amendments to LB 30.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Carsten, did you wish to speak on the committee amendments?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I have no problem with the committee amendments and would certainly support the adoption thereto. Thank you.
