SENATOR LAMB: One person has told me he is confused about which way we are voting. Would you explain the situation?

SPEAKER NICHOL: We're voting on the Lamb motion which says that the Reference Committee decision will not be adopted but that these two bills will be referred to the Education Committee. So if you vote yes, you are voting to refer these two bills to the Education Committee. If you vote no, you are voting to follow the Reference Committee in sending to a combination of the Executive Board, which is the Referencing Committee, and the Education Committee. Everyone is here that is not excused. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. President.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 464 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on the motion.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails.
