CLERK: Mr. President, I have a request for a record vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you want a roll call vote? Okay. Back up.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 466-467 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Mr. Clerk, do you have something to read in at this time?

CLERK: Mr. President, very quickly, Constitutional Revision reports 224...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Raise the call.

CLERK: ...to General File. That is signed by Senator Rupp. (See page 467 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have notice of hearing from the Judiciary Committee.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, we will go back to General File. LB 103, is that where we left off?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, 103 was a bill offered by Senators Schmit, Beyer, Lamb and DeCamp. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 10 of this year. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, are you going to handle the bill?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, LB 103 is a bill that came through Public Works Committee and, basically, the main thing this bill does is to amend the statutes so that a dam less than 25 feet high, with a storage capacity of less than 15 acre feet would not have to have a permit. Other...Section 1, the amendments in this section modify fee language but do not change any of the fees. The amendment
