CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner's amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I would waive closing.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. Any discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. LB 283.

CLERK: (Read title.) The bill was read on January 17 of this year, referred to the Revenue Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are Revenue Committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard, are you going to take those committee amendments?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, I shall, Mr. Speaker. LB 283 is about as innocuous as LB 282. Last year, as we were adopting our sales and income tax rate, on Select File Senator Warner offered an amendment to establish a nine-person committee, known as the Nebraska Economic Forecasting Advisory Board, with five members of the committee to be appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislature, and four by the Governor. That committee is now in place. We have discovered, however, that there were no terms of office for the committee members. There were no rules of the road with respect to expenses. There were no provisions regarding the designation of a chairperson and a vice-chairperson, and so on. So we did a little cleanup bill in the interim to correct the deficiencies in the
