

bill from the CPA and the public accountant community. That opposition melted, however, in the face of the committee amendments because those folks said, all we are here for is to make certain that any information that is acquired by the Auditor of Public Accounts is acquired confidentially and is fully protected. So these committee amendments are agreed to by all principals, including the folk involved in this bill. I, at this time, would move the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, did you wish to speak about the committee amendments?

SENATOR LANDIS: Very briefly. But I would like to say that every now and then, two, three times maybe during a session, the Legislature gets to heal one of the deep clefts in the executive branch. This is like the Hatfield and McCoy's getting together for Thanksgiving dinner together. I appreciate the chance to vote in favor of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. The board wasn't working, so if you voted, vote again. It's seldom you get to do that. We're voting on the committee amendments. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I would now move LB 345.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 345 has advanced. LB 152.

CLERK: (Read title.) The bill was read on January 14. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Appropriations
