

SENATOR DECAMP: No, there were no limitations. We created the limitations when we created multibank. There were no limitations whatsoever before that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's all right, okay. Are there any other institutions, FirstTier aside, that are pressing up against the 9 percent limitation?

SENATOR DECAMP: You know I don't have the exact information. But I've got to think. I just heard, on the radio a week or so ago, that NBC was putting all their institutions together. Now that has got to get them up into I'm going to guess the billion dollar category. So they wouldn't be pressing right against it. But they would, yes, they would still have some room to go. Other than that I don't know what First National of Omaha is. Let me see. I have some numbers here. You want me to read them so everybody has them real quick?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay. Here is what it says, September 30, 1984, deposits, and just to certify this, where did I get it? It's from...I'm not sure that is certifying, anyway this is from Don Adams. Okay. I'm sure they are right. State of Nebraska \$17,822,104,000. Okay? Omaha National Bank \$631,798,000, all bank deposits \$631,798,000. First National Bank-Lincoln \$607,613,000, bank deposits identical \$607,613,000. Okay, so let's add those up real quick, 6 and 6 are 12, roughly \$1.3 billion, and what did we decide it would be, about \$1.5. So they are within a couple hundred million. Okay, let's keep going. First National Bank-Omaha \$475,573,000, and that is all deposits, bank deposits, same thing, \$475,573,000. Norwest Bank-Omaha \$429,657,000. Of course, when we talk about Norwest, as you know, there are a number of institutions in the state, but this is only the one. I don't know. They may be forming a multibank holding company and putting them all together. I don't know that. National Bank of Commerce-Lincoln \$304,590,000. Okay, but remember when we talked about NBC I think they have, as I heard on the radio or something, they are going to put all their institutions together. I think that will put them right at the billion dollar category. If anybody listening has any additional information that would correct any errors I might have made, let me know right away because I am just giving you the information I think is right.
